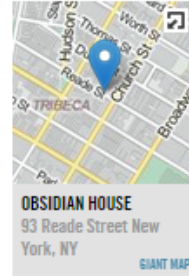

## Condos in the City's Second-Oldest Cast Iron Building Are Here

Two of the four large apartments in the rental to condo conversion at 93 Reade Street are on the market. [Obsidian House](#), the city's **second-oldest cast iron building** so called for its dark facade and "unusual extruded roofline" that was added by WORKac and "resembles jagged forms of volcanic rock," has a three-story, five-bedroom penthouse with a **rooftop shower spa tub** now on the market for \$7.45 million, and three two-bedroom loft style residences, one of which is on the market for \$2.95 million. The property is developed by Knightsbridge, who is also behind Shigeru Ban's lauded Cast Iron House.
